It Has (Literally) Been a Ground-Breaking Year!

As the team gathered at the new shelter to set up for the ground breaking ceremony a rainbow arched over the site. Some say it was a sign of good things to come, others saw it as a sign from passed shelter friends smiling down upon us. Whatever the symbolism may be we know that November 30th, 2016 will forever be a momentous day and the rainbow was validation for us that all of our hard work was paying off.

After four solid years of fundraising we are proud to say that construction has begun. Just today (Dec. 5th, 2016) as I passed the site there was dirt being moved by heavy construction equipment. It is hard to contain the joy we feel knowing we will soon be moving the animals to clean, safe and adequate housing. In approximately 13

months we will be parading the animals to their new home.

The new shelter will have space to safely house approximately 300 animals. The cats will have colony-type housing with outdoor lanais for spending lazy days in the sun. Dogs will have dry, clean kennels free from rats and fear of flooding in a heavy rain. Rabbits, small mammals and exotics will have their own rooms with adequate housing for enrichment and safety. The FKSPCA will finally be able to have structured humane education programs including spring and summer camps for our community children and behavior counseling / training to strengthen the human-animal bond and keep the animals in the home. Finally, the FKSPCA will continue to offer free and low-cost spay/neuter, however the new facility will enable us to provide the services on a weekly basis as opposed to monthly.

We are over-the-moon excited that construction has begun and I want to thank everyone for the part they played in getting us here. We couldn't have done it without you. Over the next year we will be raising the final dollars needed to furnish the new facility. If you would like to help us reach the final million dollar goal you can contribute in several ways. Holiday Health & Safety Tips for Your Companions


